

You guys are making a simple thing complicated.

- 1) Opt-out doesn't work - I don't have time to opt-out to 100 spam messages each day only to be inundated with 100 new ones tomorrow. **CHANGE THE OPT-OUT REGULATION TO AN OPT-IN REGULATION.**
- 2) **OUTLAW AUTORESPONDERS** or at least limit them to 100 emails or less each mailing.
- 3) Create a Do Not Email Registry and allow us who'd be on that list to forward those spam messages back to you for analysis.
- 4) If I opt-in on one company's list, that doesn't mean I want to be on other company's lists without specifically opting in on their list as well.
- 5) Set up a system whereby I can automatically delete email from a foreign address or in any language other than English.
- 6) A drastic idea, but one that might work: **SHUT DOWN THE INTERNET BACKBONE** for one day, with all messages being bounced or deleted. That would stop wholesale email spammers. Give plenty of notice when this shutdown would occur.
- 7) Create a program that would automatically send back to the **ACTUAL** originator of an email (not from those harvested email addresses spammers use) a 'cease' notice.
