I support the new Contact Lens Law.

Congress passed the Fairness to Contact Lens Consumers Act of 2003. It says once your contact lens fitting is done, your eye doctor must give you a copy of your own prescription - whether you ask for it or not. If he or she doesn't provide you your prescription, it is now a violation of Federal law.

Your eye doctor can not charge you for a copy of your prescription. He or she can not make you sign a waiver. He or she can not make you buy lenses as a condition of receiving your prescription. You have no obligation to buy your contact lenses from your eye doctor.
