I am very interested in the
F.T.C. creating a centralized national
"Do Not Call Registry."

Since I retired two years ago,
I have been "plagued" with telemarketers.
The calls come as early as 8:30am and
as late as 9:30pm. Calls come even on
Sunday (which I really think is terrible
to bother people on the Sabbath day.
When I do answer the telephone
and it's a telemarketer, some are rude,
argumentative, and disrespectful.

Now I use our answering
machine to screen my calls and
most telemarketers will hang up when
the answering machine comes on, but
some will actually leave messages
for us to call them on a great
new product:

I have even answered the phone
and heard a recording of a telemarketer
making a sales pitch. I find that
such an invasion of my time.

I resent telemarketers interrupting
my privacy in my own home and
wish to have the authority of getting
my name on a national "Do Not Call List".
Today I had four calls this

morning between 8:45 and 10:15
and when the answering machine
came on, two calls hung up and
two left soliciting messages. One
of the calls came from Texas (and
I live in Maryland!!)

As a homeowner and
private citizen I really feel some
control must be implemented
in telemarketers invading the
privacy of our home through
the phone telemarketing!!

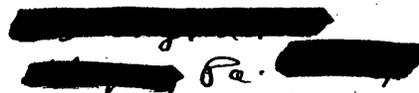
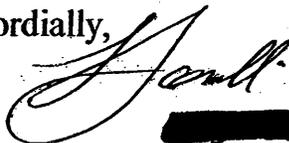
Having been in sales (directly & indirectly) all of my adult life I do understand the need for marketing, and to some extent telemarketing.

Re: Do Not Call Registry

I think that having a national Do Not Call Registry is an excellent idea? In fact, I would go further and require that telemarketers, charity solicitors, and similar callers be limited to telephoning only people who have said that they wish to be on a Please Call Registry. In other words, telephone only the people who actively want to receive such, calls and do not bother the rest of us.

The free speech provisions of the First Amendment do not give the telemarketers the right to telephone people at home with their commercial messages. The difference is between a public place, such as the street or a park, and a person's home. The telemarketer does not have the right to enter my home by a telephone call without my having invited him in. Answering the telephone when you do not know who is calling is not inviting a person into your home. We have the right to not receive harassing telephone calls. Uninvited telemarketers are making harassing telephone calls.

I also urge that the telemarketing businesses be required to subscribe to the registry.

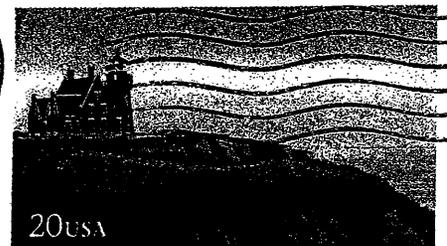

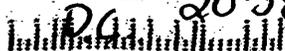
