Dear Sirs:

I strongly endorse the proposal to amend the Telemarketing Sales Rule by creating a “do not call” registry. Telemarketing imposes a cost on me – it requires me to stop what I am doing, answer the phone, and spend several seconds dealing with the caller. I cannot avoid this cost except by discontinuing telephone service, which is not practical. Marketers should not make me bear their marketing costs without my consent.

With respect to your specific questions:

- A telephone number should remain on the “do not call” registry until the subscriber asks **for** it to be removed or discontinues his service at that number. It would probably be worthwhile sending a letter every four years reminding the subscriber that he is on the registry and telling him how to remove his name if he wishes – but **not** requiring him to do anything if he wishes to stay on the registry.
- The subscriber should be the person to request listing, in order to ensure responsibility. If more than one person is listed as subscriber, **any** one should be able to request listing. Third parties should be permitted to collect and forward requests but only if in writing, with signatures, and with proper security measures (which are needed anyway – see below).
- For security, a written notice should be sent to anyone requesting his name be placed on the registry with instructions on how to correct an error or remove his name at any time in the future. The name should not go onto the registry until at least two weeks after the notice is mailed. People should be able to verify whether their name is on the registry by calling a telephone number.
- The registry may need to be “all or nothing” for simplicity, but more refined choices would be desirable if they are feasible at modest additional cost.







My wife and I agree with Mr. Decker's contention that a central part of preserving privacy is protecting "the right to be left alone." 


