

As per the “Muhammad Ali Act” – Section (11) (d), all sanctioning organizations will not be entitled to receive any compensation in connection with a boxing match unless by January 31, 2001 (and each year after) they submit to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) and to the ABC the following information:

- A complete description of the organization's ratings criteria, policies, and sanctioning fee schedule
- The bylaws of the organization
- The appeals procedure of the organization for a boxer's rating, and
- A list and business address of the organization's officials who vote on the ratings of the boxers

Instead of submitting this information to the FTC the organization may post all this information on their web site (Internet) for public view. Please note that even if this information is posted on your web site it still must be sent to the ABC by January 31<sup>st</sup> of each year.

## IBF RATINGS CRITERIA

1. No boxer shall be rated in more than one (1) weight division.
2. WBA and WBC World Champions will not appear in the numerical ratings.
3. WBA and WBC World Champions will be listed above rated fighters for the limited purpose of unification.
4. Ratings must be solely based on win/loss records, level of competition and activity. The records of any top ten (10) rated boxer must be verified.
5. For a boxer to be considered for the top ten (10) he must have had at least twelve (12) professional fights.
6. For a boxer to be rated in the top ten (10) and compete for a world title he must have competed in at least two (2) bouts scheduled for ten (10) rounds.
7. For a boxer to remain in the top ten (10) he must:
  - A) Compete at least once during a twelve (12) month period from the time a boxer gets rated and must also compete within six (6) pounds of his rated weight and;
  - B) must have competed against another top ten (10) rated boxer within an eighteen (18) month period from the time the boxer gets rated.

A boxer who does not meet this level of competition shall not retain his rating. Exceptions will be made for injuries with proper medical documentation.

8. If a top ten (10) rated boxer losses to an un-rated boxer then the rated boxer should be lowered at least one position in the ratings. The un-rated boxer should be considered for a rating in the top ten (10).
9. If two boxers are rated in the top ten (10) and compete against each other then the following shall apply:
  - A) If the lower ranked boxer wins then this boxer shall take the position of the higher rated fighter.
  - B) The higher rated fighter shall be lowered in the ratings.
10. For a boxer to be rated in the number one (1) or two (2) position he Must be rated in one of the top five (5) positions and beat another boxer rated in one of the top five (5) positions.
11. Boxers that step aside when in a mandatory position will be lowered at least two (2) positions in the ratings.
12. Boxers that contract to fight for other world titles or elimination bouts shall be considered unavailable.
13. It is the responsibility of the boxer's management to notify the Ratings Committee of a boxer's activity.
14. All ratings criteria are subject to exception by approval of the Ratings Committee.

**CONSTITUTION OF THE  
INTERNATIONAL BOXING FEDERATION/UNITED STATES BOXING ASSOCIATION  
IBF/USBA  
As Amended and Adopted May 31, 2000  
Acapulco, Mexico**

**ARTICLE I  
Title**

The Association hereinafter constituted shall be known as THE INTERNATIONAL BOXING FEDERATION, INC. and the UNITED STATES BOXING ASSOCIATION ("IBF/USBA").

**ARTICLE II  
Objects and Purposes**

The IBF/USBA is a voluntary Association comprised of managers, promoters, trainers, physicians, seconds, boxers, referees, matchmakers, timekeepers, judges, announcers, media commentators, writers, and boxing fans for the purpose of obtaining greater efficiency and uniformity in the supervision of professional boxing; and for more effective control and regulation of professional boxing; and to encourage and assist professional boxing.

It shall also encourage and inspire a greater public appreciation of boxing on all levels as a universal sport and as a builder of character and body. The activities of the IBF/USBA shall include:

(a) The IBF/USBA shall receive from its members and other athletic commissions the results of professional boxing contests promptly after they are held; shall receive notice of all actions of such commissions suspending or revoking the licenses of professional boxers, because of impaired physical condition, promptly following the taking of such action; and shall receive from its members and other athletic commissions notice of actions of such commissions suspending or revoking the licenses of professional boxers, managers, seconds, promoters, officials and other licenses, if any, because of conduct detrimental to honestly conducted professional boxing, promptly following the taking of such action, and shall assemble and circulate all such information through regular bulletins among its members.

(b) The IBF/USBA shall establish its champions and monthly ratings in each weight division of up to fifteen boxers in such divisions, and shall make such ratings available to its members and to the media.

(c) The IBF/USBA shall from time to time promulgate suggested rules and standards for boxing guidance and for the scoring of boxing contests which may be acceptable for universal adoption, and shall encourage a unity of action thereon.

(d) The IBF/USBA shall provide championship belts to be awarded holders of championship titles in established weight classes, as recognized by it.

(e) The IBF/USBA shall encourage and assist the sport of boxing in the states and territories of the United States and throughout the world, and shall strive to improve the public relations of the sport through educational means.

(f) The IBF/USBA shall, so far as the law may permit, acquire, purchase, lease or otherwise obtain for its use, any real and personal property, and also sell, lease, invest, deal with or otherwise dispose of for its benefit any such real or personal property.

(g) The IBF/USBA shall do all other lawful things necessary, incidental or conducive to the attainment of the foregoing objectives and purposes.

(h) Members will be recognized and will be granted the courtesy of being heard from the floor at the annual conventions.

### **ARTICLE III**

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

All those persons who have paid membership dues to the IBF/USBA shall be members.

#### **VOTING QUALIFICATION**

Each member in good standing present at the annual convention is entitled to one vote.

Only those members in good standing who have been continuous members for the five years preceding an election are entitled to vote for officers.

### **ARTICLE IV**

#### **Officers**

The Officers of the IBF/USBA shall be a President, four Vice Presidents, a Treasurer, an Executive Secretary, a Legal Advisor and a Medical Advisor. All of the

above Officers, with the exception of the Executive Secretary, Legal Advisor and the Medical Advisor, shall be elected by a majority vote at the Annual Convention. The date, time and place of the election of the Officers will be set by the President during the first meeting day of the Convention, with a minimum of twenty four hours before the election is to take place.

All elected officers shall hold office for four years, or until their successors have been duly elected and qualified.

Only former United States State Commissioners, former Executive Directors of United States State Commissions, former members of the Executive Committee of the USBA or IBF, or persons who have held office in either organization within the past five (5) years and been members in good standing according to the Constitution and Bylaws for the past five consecutive years shall be qualified for nomination as President and Treasurer.

A minimum of two of the four vice president positions must be filled by qualified members from the United States. All those active members who have been members in good standing according to the terms of the Constitution and Bylaws for five consecutive years are eligible for nomination for the positions of First, Second, Third and Fourth Vice President. Vice presidents cannot function in the capacity of referees, judges or any other position which might present a conflict of interest while holding the position of vice president.

The President of IBF/USBA shall not hold the position of the President in another international boxing governing body at the same time. The President, Treasurer, Executive Secretary and Ratings Chairman shall be compensated, as determined by the Executive Committee.

## **ARTICLE V Government**

In the interim between the annual conventions, the administration of the affairs of the IBF/USBA shall be conducted by the Officers, subject to the direction of the Executive Committee. This Committee shall consist of the President, four Vice Presidents, the Executive Secretary, the Treasurer, the Legal Advisor, the Medical Advisor, the Chairman of the Ratings Committee and the Chairman of the Championships Committee.

## **ARTICLE VI Finance**

The membership dues shall be established annually by majority vote of the members present at the annual meeting of the IBF/USBA.

The Executive Committee may deal with the funds of the IBF/USBA as in their discretion they may deem necessary. The Executive Committee may authorize the letting of contracts for any terms and conditions to an executive officer or any other person or persons it deems necessary, in a full or part time position to conduct the day to day business of the organization.

The Executive Committee shall have full power to authorize disbursements of funds through the President and Treasurer, in payment of the proper expenses of the IBF/USBA. All disbursement checks shall be issued and signed by the Treasurer or President and approved by the President.

## **ARTICLE VII Meetings of the IBF/USBA**

The Annual Meetings of the IBF/USBA shall be held during a month selected by the convention body each year. If a place should not be designated in the regular convention assembled, a Convention Committee shall be appointed by the President, which shall make the necessary arrangements, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

At all meetings of the IBF/USBA, a quorum shall consist of one-third of the qualified members registered in attendance.

At all meetings of the IBF/USBA, the following shall be the order of business:

- 1 . Roll call of Delegates, and report of Credentials Committee.
2. Reading of Minutes.
3. Officer's Reports.
4. Reports of Committees.
5. Unfinished business.
6. Resolutions, and new business.
7. Election of officers every four years.
8. Adjournment.

The Executive Committee shall meet a minimum of two times between the annual meetings of the IBF/USBA.

## **ARTICLE VIII Amendments**

No Amendment shall be made to the Constitution except at the annual meeting and by two-thirds vote of the qualified members present and voting. All proposed Amendments shall be first presented to the Legislative Committee in writing at least thirty days before the annual meeting. The Legislative Committee shall forward to the Executive Secretary of the IBF/USBA a copy of all such proposed Amendments, together with their report on the same, at least twenty days before the annual meeting. The Executive Secretary thereupon, shall mail to each member of the IBF/USBA a copy of all such proposed amendments at least fifteen days before the annual meeting.

**BY-LAWS OF  
THE INTERNATIONAL BOXING FEDERATION  
AND THE  
UNITED STATES BOXING ASSOCIATION  
IBF/USBA  
As Amended and Adopted May 31, 2000  
Acapulco, Mexico**

**1. Election of Officers**

The Officers of the IBF/USBA shall be a President, four Vice Presidents, a Treasurer, an Executive Secretary, a Legal Advisor and a Medical Advisor. The President, Vice Presidents and Treasurer shall be elected by a majority vote at the Annual Convention. The date, time, and place of the election of the Officers will be set by the President during the first meeting day of the Convention, with a minimum of twenty-four hours before the election is to take place. The Executive Secretary, the Medical Advisor and the Legal Advisor shall be appointed by the President. No individual shall be permitted to seek election to more than one office at any given election. Officers shall be elected every four years at the Annual Convention by majority vote of those members entitled to vote for officers as provided in Article III of the Constitution. No individual shall be nominated to more than one elected office for any given election.

**2. Duties of Officers and Executive Secretary**

The President shall preside at all meetings of the IBF/USBA, and shall perform such other duties as pertain to the office of President. The Vice Presidents, in the order of their election, shall have all the powers and perform all the duties of the President in his absence or inability to perform the same, in which case the four Vice Presidents shall designate one of them to preside in place of the President.

The Executive Secretary shall keep the records of the IBF/USBA conduct all the official correspondence, issue notice of all meetings of the IBF/USBA, keep a complete record of all contests and exhibitions held under the auspices of the IBF/USBA, and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Constitution and By-Laws of the IBF/USBA.

The Treasurer shall receive all monies of the IBF/USBA, and pay all bills approved by the President of the IBF/USBA, provided that necessary minor expenses which may necessarily be paid by any Committee may be turned into the Treasurer as cash if recorded in detail, duly attested by such Committee and approved by the IBF/USBA. The Treasurer shall, when required by the IBF/USBA, or its Executive

Committee, submit and turn over to said IBF/USBA, or Committee all monies, accounts, books, papers, vouchers and records appertaining to his office, and shall turn the same over to his successor, when elected. He shall at each Annual Meeting render a complete report of the IBF/USBA finances. He shall be bonded (at the expense of the IBF/USBA) in a sum to be fixed by the IBF/USBA of not less than \$5,000.00. The Treasurer shall open appropriate bank accounts, in the name of the International Boxing Federation.

### 3. Committees

Following each Annual Meeting of the IBF/USBA, the President shall appoint the following Committees: Ratings, Legislative, Medical, Nominating, Credentials and Championship, and such other committees as deemed advisable.

The Ratings Committee shall prepare ratings of the boxers in each weight division in accordance with the provisions of Article II, Section "6" of the Constitution of the IBF/USBA.

The Legislative Committee shall have the duty of studying all proposed Amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of the IBF/USBA, and make its report in accordance with Article VIII of the Constitution; but this provision shall not prevent the IBF/USBA from acting upon any Amendment suggested by a member in writing.

The Nominating Committee shall have the duty of submitting to the membership of the IBF/USBA, after consideration of their respective qualifications, a list of recommended nominees for election to the various elective offices of the IBF/USBA. Such list shall be submitted by mail to all members of the IBF/USBA in good standing not later than thirty days prior to the date fixed for the opening of the Annual Meeting of the IBF/USBA at which such election is intended to take place. The submissions of such recommendations for election to the various offices of the IBF/USBA shall not preclude nomination from the floor of other qualified individuals for the same respective offices.

The Credentials Committee shall determine the qualification of members for voting on general issues and for officers as described in Article III of the Constitution.

The Medical Committee shall promulgate minimum safety standards for boxers and review medical records when necessary.

The Championship Committee shall make quarterly reports to the President for publication by the Executive Secretary of notice of upcoming mandatory fights and shall review requests for exceptions to the rules and make recommendations to the Executive Committee.

The duties of the other Committees shall be such as may be assigned to them by the President.

#### **4. Voting**

At the Annual Meetings of the IBF/USBA, voting on all matters requiring a vote, shall be determined by the majority of those present and qualified to vote, with the exception of votes to amend the Constitution or By-Laws.

When any matter is to be voted upon in the Convention, any member present and qualified to cast a vote may call for the Ayes and Noes. If the call is sustained by one-fifth of the qualified voters present, the roll shall be called and the vote tabulated by the Ayes and Noes accordingly.

In the interim between the Annual Conventions, the administration of the affairs of the IBF/USBA shall be conducted by the Executive Committee as provided for in Article V of the Constitution. The President may at any time call for a vote by mail or fax of the Executive Committee. Any vote by the Executive Committee to be effective must be a majority vote of the whole Committee.


#### **5. Amendments**

No Amendment shall be made to the By-Laws except at the Annual Meeting and by two-thirds vote of the qualified members present and voting. All proposed amendments shall be first presented to the Legislative Committee in writing at least thirty days before the Annual Meeting. The Legislative Committee shall forward to the Executive Secretary of the IBF/USBA a copy of all such proposed Amendments, together with their report on the same, at least twenty days before the Annual Meeting. The Executive Secretary thereupon shall mail to each member of the IBF/USBA a copy of all such proposed Amendments, at least fifteen days before the Annual Meeting. The IBF/USBA at its annual Convention can at any time by a suspension of the rules hear and enact Amendments to the Constitution or Bylaws by unanimous consent.

## IBF RATINGS APPEAL PROCEDURE

1. The President of the IBF/USBA will appoint a Chairman and two other additional members from the membership to the committee to hear any appeals. The Executive Committee must approve each panel.
2. All appeals shall be in writing from the complainant or his designated representative and shall be sent to the Chairman of the Ratings Committee within ten (10) days from the date the ratings are posted on the official IBF/USBA web site at **IBF-USBA-BOXING.COM**. Failure to appeal within ten (10) days shall constitute a waiver of the right to appeal.
3. The appeal shall list with specificity the effect that such change in rating shall have on all interested parties.
4. The President of the IBF/USBA shall notify the complainant of the time and date of the hearing.
5. The complainant will be notified in writing of the results of the hearing within seven (7) days after completion of the hearing.
